Allowed to proceed to Invermein to take charge of sheep for Mr George Sparke Esq for 12 months. TOL passport 39/021, 22 Jan 1839, 4/4237 (reel 967). Allowed to remain in the employ of Mr RB Dawson of Black Creek for 12 months. TOL passport 40/051, 2 Mar 1840, 4/4239 (reel 967). Allowed to proceed to Liverpool Plains in the service of Mr Benjamin Singleton for 12 months.

Jul 1844	TOL cancelled for being absent from the district

SRNSW reel 662 monthly returns of summary punishment, Maitland p79. 5 August 1836, Patrick Bennett, Hooghly, life, 1825, assigned to Mr Clark, disobedience of orders, 50 lashes.

SRNSW 9/2689 Iron Gangs 1827-1830: Nov 1827, p 26, Bennit, Patrick, Hooghley, 21-5 Mile Station [gang]

Newcastle Gaol Entrance Books, Patrick Bennett, Hooghley 1825, labourer frm Limerick, admitted 29 September 1831 from Patersons Plains for one month solitary confinement for insolence and imposing on the court. Returned to his master 27 October.

NSWGG 5 July 1844 Ticket of Leave cancelled for being absent from district (also in Mait Mercury 13 July 1844).
