1826 Feb	arrived in Sydney on the <i>Mangles</i> and assigned to John Eales
1827 Dec	sent from Wallis Plains to Sydney Gaol, charged with robbery
1828 Feb	acquitted and discharged to Newcastle in March
1828 Nov	in a road gang 27 at Wallis Plains (Maitland), as per 1828 Census
1830 Feb	still in road gang 27 (which is an iron gang)
1832 Oct	certificate of freedom
