1830 May	arrived in Sydney on the <i>Nithsdale</i> and assigned to H Pilcher, Hunter River
1833 Oct	absconded from John Eales, Hunter River
1839 Nov	Certificate of Freedom
1842	sentenced to 2 years on public roads for sheep stealing
1850	died after a fight at Murrurundi
