<b>T.O.L.</b>	45/348, 13 February 1845, 4/4197 (reel 955), Maitland district on recommendation of the Border Police, New England. Altered to Paterson 9 January 1846. TOLPPT 47/696, 18 October 1847, 4/4267, allowed to remain in the service of Mr John Eales at Liverpool Plains for 6 months. TOLPPT 48/505, 14 August 1848, 4/4270 (reel 977), allowed to remain in New England for 12 months in service of Mr Marsh.
