Mar 1840	working for John Eales at Liverpool Plains
May 1841	working for John Eales at Liverpool Plains for a further 12 months
Aug 1842	working for Mr Baldwin at Liverpool Plains for 12 months
Jan 1845	working for Messrs Martin and Combes at Liverpool Plains for 12 months
Feb 1846	working for P Brodie at Liverpool Plains
Apr 1847	gained a Conditional Pardon
July 1852	probably died at Newcastle Hospital aged 43, occupation shepherd
