Allowed to remain at Liverpool Plains in the employ of the Executors of Messrs Loder. TOLPPT 42/529, 25 April 1842, 4/4245 (reel 969). Allowed to proceed to Liverpool Plains in the service of the Executors of the late Messrs Loder for 12 months. TOLPPT 43/710, 1 July 1843, 4/4250 (reel 971). Allowed to remain in the service of Mr John Eales at Liverpool Plains for 12 months (rec Maitland Bench). TOLPPT 45/692, 19 July 1845, 4/4258 (reel 974). Allowed to remain in the service of Mr John Eales at Duri Liverpool Plains for 12 months (rec Murrurundi Bench).
