Allowed to proceed to the New England for 12 months in the service of Mr Trepard, exempt from the quarterly muster. TOL passport 40/141, 24 Apr 1840, 4/4239, reel 967, rec of Scone Bench. Allowed to remain in the service of Mr J Tingle (Single?) of Liverpool Plains. TOL passport 41/218, 12 May 1841, 4/4242, reel 968, rec of Scone Bench. Allowed to proceed to Liverpool Plains in the service of Mr J Single for 12 months.

Colonial Secretary's correspondence

CL In-letter to Col Sec from FP Trapard [Trapand?] at Peels River 22 July 1837, requesting pass from muster for two ticket of leave holders (invermein district) who are going with him as shepherds to New England, 150 miles from Invermein Bench. They are William Johnstone per Mellish 1829 and Joseph Jefferies, native of Manchester. CSLS 37/763 in 4/3684, 23 September 1837, Harrington to Princ Sup. Convicts, p147 (reel 1050). Re William Johnston per Mellish and Joseph Jefferies (ship not stated), holding TOL's for Invermein, to be exempt from the quarterly muster, in the service of Mr Tresrand (?) at Peel's River.
