DANIEL JONES, JOHN PEDDRICK, Theft > simple larceny, 5th January 1832.

Fifth Middlesex Jury, before Mr. Sergeant Arabin.

486. DANIEL JONES and JOHN PEDDRICK were indicted for stealing, on the 14th of December , 1 shirt, value 3s. , the goods of Timothy White .

ELIZABETH WHITE . I am the wife of Timothy White , and live in York-street, Kingsland-road . On the 14th of December I hung some things out to dry, and among them some shirts; I missed one of them.

CHARLES BENFIELD . I keep cows, and live three doors from White's. I had seen the two prisoners within four or five yards of her garden; they were both together, and I told Waller of them.

CHARLES WALLER . I am a Policeman. Benfield gave me information, and I took the prisoners; I found this shirt in Peddrick's jacket - he said he had picked it up.

Jones' Defence. Peddrick told me he had picked up a shirt, and the officer took us into custody.

Peddrick's Defence. I was going along, and picked it up.

JONES - GUILTY . Aged 18, Transported for Seven Years .
