T.O.L.	41/1093, 16 May 1841, Scone District, renewed and altered to Maitland 1842 42/987, 31 March 1842, 4/4161 (reel 943), Maitland district, in lieu of 41/1093 returned mutilated and cancelled. TOLPPT 41/412, 25 September 1841, 4/4242 (reel 968). Proceed to New England in the service of Mr Smith of Breeza for 12 months. Rec Scone Bench. TOLPPT 43/359, 21 March 1843, 4/4249 (reel 971). Allowed to proceed to Darling Downs in the service of Mr John Eales for 12 months.

Certificate of Freedom for the Patrick Lawler, Earl Grey 1836, issued in 1844 with its cross referenced ticket of leave correctly matching, it is unlikely the death entry refers to Patrick Lawler who arrived on the Earl Grey in 1836.

Mar 1843	working for John Eales on the Darling Downs for 12 months
Nov 1844	certificate of freedom
