Allowed to remain in the service of Mr John B Smith at Liverpool Plains for 12 months. TOL passport 41/0243, 26 May 1841, 4/4242 reel 968 rec by Maitland Bench. Allowed to proceed to the New England in the service of Mr John Eales for 12 months. Same date and wording for John Byrne and James Coote. [also Hugh Duffey (Mangles, 1828) and George Dorking (Norfolk, 1825)] TOL passport 42/0703, 8 July 1842, 4/4246 reel 970 rec by Maitland Bench. Richard Nash, Heroine 1833 [no such person on the Heroine in 1833]. Allowed to proceed to Darling Downs in the service of Mr John Eales for 12 months (same date and wording as for Gray).
