<b>T.O.L.</b>	43/338, 3 February 1843, 4/4172 (reel 947), Maitland district (rec Paterson Bench), altered to Singleton 8 June 1847. TOLPPT 43/768, 28 July 1843, 4/4251 (reel 971). Allowed to proceed to Liverpool Plains in the service of Mr John Heales (sic) for 12 months. Rec Maitland Bench. TOLPPT 45/71, 16 January 1845, 4/4255 (reel 973). Allowed to proceed to Liverpool Plains in the service of John Eales for 12 months. TOLPPT 46/388, 28 March 1846, 4/4261 (reel 975). Allowed to remain in the service of Mr John Eales at Liverpool Plains for 12 months.

July 1843	working for John Eales at Liverpool Plains for 12 months
Jan 1845	still with John Eales at Liverpool Plains, for another 12 months
Mar 1846	still with John Eales at Liverpool Plains, for another 12 months
July 1852	Conditional Pardon
