C.P.	"second class conditional pardon no. 46/123 dated *** *** (notation on indent) CP 46/123, 2 March 1846, 4/4483 reel 799 pp245-246. Note: second class conditional pardons were issued for a while in the 1840s. They carried the condition to remain "wholly within the whole of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies and New Zealand but not elsewhere".

Morpeth 9 Sept 1847 from James Shorthouse requesting passage to the Colony for his wife and children, and indicating he holds a ticket of leave and conditional pardon (also 47/6063 in same box, earlier petition re same, including a reference by EC Close "applicant a very steady man and has been a long time in this neighbourhood". Also similar from GK Rusden, Chaplain.
