Cancelled 12 December 1839 for being absent from muster, restored 19 May 1840. 40/1183, 19 May 1840, 4/4140 (reel 936). Singleton district in lieu of 37/1338, altered to Maitland 16 June 1840. TOLPPT 43/770, 28 July 1843, 4/4251 (reel 971). Allowed to proceed to Liverpool Plains in the service of Mr John Eales for 12 months. Rec Mait Bench.

July 1831	arrived in Sydney on the Camden with a 14 year sentence for robbing a shop
July 1831	assigned on arrival to Mr Sharpe on the North Shore (Sydney)
Oct 1837	ticket-of-leave for the Liverpool district
Dec 1837	ticket-of-leave altered to Patricks Plains district
Dec 1839	ticket-of-leave cancelled for being absent from district (absconded October 1839)
May 1840	ticket-of-leave restored, for Singleton district
June 1840	ticket-of-leave altered to Maitland district (to start work for John Eales???)
July 1843	working for John Eales at Liverpool Plains for 12 months
Sep 1844	gained his freedom (served his 14 years)
